A Torah for Hameln and More


Our heartfelt thanks goes out to those who have helped us procure a Sefer Torah from America for our new synagogue.

We also thank Temple Sinai in Atlanta, Georgia, for their contribution that helped pay for the Ner Tamid.



There are so many regular activities offered in our congregation by congregants for congregants and we are grateful for their hard work and dedication.


