
Dear members, friends and supporters,

There's lots happening in our congregation in February, but let's have a look back to what happened in January.

Many members braved the cold winter winds and snow to welcome 2013 on January 8th with a New Year's Reception. Faina Pelts



We want to thank everyone who helped make the evening unforgettable. We especially thank Mr. and Mrs. Bogatschik and Mrs. Arteeva for the festive meal and program, and Faina Pelts for the organization.

We welcomed a large audience on January 17th, when we co-hosted a fascinating podium discussion between two female religious leaders. Rabbi Irit Shillor and Pastor Christine Brendel illuminated how we pray; explaining the similarities and differences in Judaism and Christianity. Many questions were posed to the speakers, making for a lively discussion of a complex theme.

It is satisfying to see that our synagogue has become an important meeting place in Hamelin.

We celebrated our annual congregational Tu BiShevat Seder with Rabbi Assessor Adrian Schell on January 25th. Liubov, Lydmylla and Feana created a Seder table for the "New Year of the Trees" laden with the "first fruits" and nuts, juices and wine. Together we participated in this beautiful tradition, which has its origins in the 16th century. The Seder was relaxed and fun for young and old, and Rachel gave everyone a gift of a Primrose plant, a symbol of hope and spring.

January 27th is international Holocaust Remembrance Day and recalls the liberation of the concentration camp in Auschwitz in 1945 by Soviet troops. At 7:00 p.m. the city of Hamelin will remember the victims of the Holocaust with a presentation of Anja Tuckermann's biography of Hugo Höllermann.

Several observances will be offered on Holocaust Remembrance Day. Our congregational choir "Shalom" has been invited to perform at Hamelin's main church, St. Bonifatius, on Sunday morning. In the evening we will be one of the sponsors of the city's commemoration when Anja Tuckermann will present the biography of Hugo Höllermann. The evening performance is open to the public and free of charge.

Jewish February

We will celebrate Purim this year on the 14th of Adar, Sunday, February 24th at 3:00 p.m. The services will be led by Adrain Schell.

We will listen to Adrian reading from of the 100-year-old Megilah, which Rabbi Shillor donated to our synagogue last year, and read responsively in Hebrew, German, Russian and English. Our holiday recalls the story from 357 B.C.E. when the evil Haman plotted to destroy the Persian Jews. Queen Esther, using brains, beauty and a strong faith in God, succeeded in saving our people from annihilation. There have been many "Hamans" in our history and we have and will survive them all.



Purim is a colorful and noisy holiday. Hopefully many people will come to the service in costume and help recount our history, observing the tradition of drowning out the name of Haman with graggers (noisemakers).

For those members confined to hospital or home, Schlachmones baskets will be delivered. These baskets of food will bring a little bit of Purim to those who are ill.

We will gather around our festively decorated tables, sharing Hamentaschen, baked for the sixteenth year by Polina Pelts' German class. In addition, we will enjoy fruits, sweets, wine and juice and remember with gratitude how Esther saved our people so long ago.

Our festivities will end with a Purim concert from Elena Kondraschowa and Stella Perevalova from Hannover.

Rabbi Talk
