The dedication of our beautiful new synagogue was not only a historic day for us but also for the city of Hamelin, the state of Lower Saxony and for Germany. The weekend's celebrations were a wonderful mixture of spirituality, joyous celebration and touching moments.

We began with Friday night services on February 18th. This was the very first service in our new home. The sanctuary was filled as many members and friends gathered together to welcome Shabbat and to dedicate our new synagogue as a congregation. As vice president Polina Pelts lit the Shabbat candles for the first time in our new Jewish home, many were moved to tears. 73 years after Jewish life on this spot was extinguished, the warm glow of the Shabbat candles and all they represent shone again. This moment captured the continuity of Jewish life in Hamelin like no other.







Many friends joined us for the service, beautifully led by Rabbi Irit Shillor. Rebekka Dohme lent her warm and lovely voice to the service and Faina Pelts accompanied her, playing the familiar melodies on the piano. The sanctuary was filled with our voices in song and prayer. We were finally home. Special guests in attendance were Susanne Böttcher and Annette Wellner whose grandmother Rosa Culp had been a member of the pre-war Hamelin congregation. They presented the congregation with a prayer book from their cousin, Ute Siegler. Many words of congratulation from former Jewish citizens of Hamelin from as far away as Israel and Australia were received and read aloud.

In recognition of the dedication our new synagogue, Rabbi Shillor offered a Torah service. This was of special significance because she read from both our Torah scrolls. The "new" Torah had been brought by honored guest, Rabbi Jo David of New York. Rabbi David and her husband, Sofer Neil Yerman had procured a scroll for our new synagogue. Donations from the Hamelin churches and American Jewish donors, Craig Beresin, Alex Yarosh and an anonymous donor had enabled the purchase of the scroll. Rabbi David and Sofer Yerman donated the Atzei Chayim and silver Rimonim. Sofer Yerman certified that the scroll is kosher and dated it to be about 100 years old and having been written in Germany—a true homecoming! Please read the following article from the WUPJ News:

The Jewish Congregation of Hamelin, the World Union affiliate in Hamelin, Germany, was presented with a Torah scroll on February 5 during a ceremony at the World Union's New York office.

"The acquisition of this scroll was made possible by generous donations by ACK Hameln (Arbeitskreis Christliche Kirchen), a consortium of churches in Hamelin, and individuals living in the United States," said the program printed for the occasion. "This sefer Torah was written in Germany about a hundred years ago and has served congregations in Israel and the United States. Soon it will be returning home."

JGH now serves over 200 members and is affiliated with the World Union, the Union of Progressive Jews in Germany and the Central Council of Jews of Germany. On February 20, it will be dedicating its new synagogue—the first building specifically constructed for a Progressive congregation in postwar Germany—on the spot where the town's last synagogue was destroyed in 1938 during Kristalnacht.

The Torah was restored by sofer (scribe) Neil Yerman, whose wife, Rabbi Jo David, was instrumental in getting today's JGH established in her role as founder and executive director of the Jewish Appleseed Foundation, which works with young and nascent congregations throughout the world.

The "crowns" above certain letters were created by several honored participants, including Rabbi Gary Bretton-Granatoor, the World Union's vice president for philanthropy; Irit Michaelson, general secretary of the Union of Progressive Jews in Germany; Rabbi Daniel Freelander, senior vice president of the Union for Reform Judaism; and vice-consul Werner-Ciprian Fugel, representing the German Consulate General. Rebekka Dohme, daughter of JGH founder and President Rachel Dohme, was honored with creating the crown above the first letter of the Torah on behalf of the congregation.




The official moment finally arrived. On Sunday, February 20 at 3:00 p.m. we dedicated our new synagogue, "Beitenu" (Our House). Every available inch of floor space was used to seat our members, patrons, foundation members, donors, religious leaders and local, state and national political representatives. The dedication service began with Patrizia Berhovski and Sören Wendt carrying the two Torah scrolls under the Chuppah, carried by founding members, Emma Lebedinska, Feana Engler, Dr. Felix Peres and Felix Golbereg as Rebekka Dohme sang "Ma Tovu." A moving religious service followed, led by Rabbi Irit Shillor. Wladimir Pesok blew the shofar and Polina Pelts lit the Ner Tamid. Each moment was moving and historic.

It has been a long journey but one paved with many moments of solidarity and support. So many people from so many places have helped us reach this momentous occasion and we are eternally grateful.

Following the religious service, dignitaries spoke words of congratulations. Among those who spoke were State Minister of Culture, Dr. Bernd Althusmann, Mayor Susanne Lippmann, and County Commissioner Rudiger Butte, President of the German Rabbinical Assembly, Rabbi Dr. Henry G. Brandt, President of the European Union of Progressive Judaism, Leslie Bergmann, President of the Union of Progressive Jews of Germany, Dr. Jan Mühlstein, President of the liberal state board of Jewish congregations, Katarina Seidler, General Secretary of the Central Council of Jews of Germany, Stephan Kramer, and many more.

Our synagogue choir "Schalom" musically framed the blocks of speakers. A festive reception was offered in heated tents in our garden afterwards and many lingered for conversation and a closer look at the beautifully conceptualized building. The elliptical, egg-shaped form creates a feeling of comfort. Design architect Frank Taylor and the architectural firm of Peter Nasarek with lead architect Cedo Bojic created a spiritual space symbolic of the new life and progressive development worthy of the first newly constructed Reform synagogue in post-Shoah Germany.

Rachel Dohme said in her opening remarks, "Most buildings are made of brick and stone. This building is made of love, patience and gratitude."
