The men of the congregation opened the afternoon with poems and red carnations for all the ladies. Our members and many guests filled the sanctuary, and extra chairs had to be found and set up to accommodate the large crowd. It was a joyous and unforgettable performance, and we thank the Central Council of Jews of Germany for their support, which made this concert possible. Sharing our Jewish culture with our non-Jewish neighbors is a positive vehicle for outreach. Music is an international language that needs no translation.

Thanks to so many contributions, large and small, we managed to raise the 400 Euros (about \$530) needed to buy the beautiful silver Hanukkia, which has been on loan in our synagogue for the past several weeks. Mr. Specht, a local Hamelin citizen, bought the Hannukia in an antique store years ago. The Hannukia was beautifully handcrafted over 100 years ago in Portugal. Dolphins grace the foot, and each movable branch is adorned with blossoms and leaves, held by a hand and can be removed.

We wish to thank everyone who contributed: Dr. Ioulia Berhowski, the members of Polina's German Class, the members of Dieter's German class, Mr. Lior Bar-Ami, Mrs. Faina Pelts, our congregational choir Shalom, and many anonymous contributors. On Shabbat Ha Gadol, March 22nd and 23rd, we were honored with a visit from Josh and Judy Herz from Rochester, New York. Josh is the son of Higa and Art Herz, of blessed memory. "Art the

Heart" as he was known to many, was instrumental in organizing support in the Rochester Reform Temple Brith Kodesh for our synagogue construction. Art was assisted by many in the Rochester community; of special mention was and is Gertrud Lind. Besides organizing fundraisers for our building project, they opened many a door and heart to our situation in Hamelin. Art worked tirelessly for healing and dialogue. It was as much an honor for us as for Josh that Rabbi Shillor asked him to carry the Torah at Saturday morning services in honor of his father.

We are still awed when we realize we are celebrating Pesach for the third year in our beautiful new synagogue. Rabbi Shillor led the Seder with more than sixty in attendance. Women of Reform Judaism

The Women of Reform Judaism (WRJ) visited Israel and Berlin as part of their Centennial Celebration Mission. The group of twenty-two women from WRJ chapters in North America spent the last two days of their trip in Berlin. The WRJ was established in 1913 and today represents more than 80,000 women in more than 500 chapters internationally. We hope the next new chapter will be in Hamelin! The WRJ is known for its service to the Jewish people and especially for their work in strengthening the development of Reform Judaism worldwide. The WRJ's YES Fund supports among other projects rabbinical students. Locally the YES Fund supported our community in the development and publication of the first book to be used in the German public schools solely about Reform Judaism, *My Judaism*. The book is now a part of

religious education in the public schools in our city and county schools.

At the invitation of WRJ President Lynn Magid Lazar, our president, Rachel Dohme, joined the group in Berlin for Shabbat. Beginning with a Shacharit service and ending with Havdallah, the women spent the day exploring Berlin. Before Havdallah, Rachel told the story of our congregation's establishment and development and synagogue construction of the first newly constructed Reform synagogue in post-war Germany. She also spent time explaining the situation for Reform Jews in Germany today with all its complexities and challenges. It was a wonderful day!
