International Women's Day on March 8th was celebrated with a concert, lovely flowers and a festive table. Our thanks go out to Polina Pelts and Valerij Bogatchyck for organizing the celebration and to Dorit Bogatchyck for all the cooking and baking.



On Sunday, March 13th, we held our annual membership meeting. Although we weren't holding elections this year, the meeting was well-attended. President Rachel Dohme offered a printed report of activities. The five-page report was not, as in previous years, read aloud. This year Rachel Dohme gave a presentation of special events from the year 2015. Among other topics, she reported that we gained eternal resting rights for our cemetery from the city of Hamelin, explained the reorganization of our children's educational program, shared the happy news of our congregation's rabbinical position, described two new building projects in the synagogue and informed the membership about the responsibilities of our BUFDI positions.

Treasurer Olga Gerr gave an excellent presentation of the congregation's finances. The auditors praised her work and found everything to be in order. The minutes of the meeting are available to members in the synagogue office.

Certainly the highlight of the month of March was our Purim celebration. Since it was Good Friday some of our neighbors may have wondered why American soldiers, pirates, kings, princesses, skeletons and cowboys were coming to the synagogue.

Our celebration began with the reading of the Megillat Esther. Rachel read the first verse in Hebrew from the scroll and Eva Schkolnikova read the Book of Esther in German and Russian.

An absolutely delightful retelling of the story by our youth group followed. The children were dressed in costume and finished their performance with two Purim songs, using the graggers they had cleverly made and decorated from Tic-Tac boxes. Faina thanked each of the children for their hard work with chocolates, adding to their collection of sweets and raising the din of little voices. What a sweet sound!

Valerij Bogatchyck and his thespians treated us to a Purim Spiel in Russian. It's hard to believe that he managed to top the Purim Spiel from last year, but he did. The costumes, music and special effects were dazzling, and the play is ready for the great stages of the world.

Polina Pelts and her culinary crew satisfied every sweet tooth with their delicious and mouth-watering plum and poppy seed homemade Hamentaschen cakes.

It was an amazing evening with an amazing congregation, and we thank everyone for their enthusiasm and dedication.
