But first a look back to a very special outing in April, which occurred after the distribution of last month's newsletter. The adventure began with meeting at the train station at 9:00 a.m. "It felt as if we were one big Jewish family! It was a day of happiness and good spirits," was Polina's summation of the day.

Polina had two more program points for the month of May in store. Another unforgettable outing for our seniors (also through the sponsorship of "Aktion Mensch") was an evening out in the theatre to hear a program of classical music. The final program was a "Senior's Breakfast." One of our younger members read her poems to the enjoyment of the breakfast bunch.

We thank "Aktion Mensch" for help and support for seed monies that address the needs of our older congregants. Polina Pelts organizes the monthly get-togethers. These programs have been very well received and are as informative as they are entertaining. We thank Polina for all her hard work and logistical talent.





On Thursday, May 5th, we observed Yom HaShoah. Rabbi Alexander Lyskovoy led a memorial service, which began with the traditional candle-lighting ceremony. The eerie light of the six yellow candles flickered in our darkened sanctuary. Prayer and text followed, and especially moving was the recitation of the Hamelin Jewish victims of the Holocaust. Rabbi Lyskovoy spoke of the great catastrophe and all that the world lost through the madness of the Shoah. Members and guests were visibly moved. It is never so poignant as on these days of remembrance that we feel how undisputable it was and is that we rebuilt our synagogue upon the exact soil it had once stood. We honor those who came before us, whose lives were cut down without mercy, and we promise to never forget them!

May 9th offered another memorial day, Victory Day, which commorates and celebrates those who fought to end WWII. We remember those who fought against tyranny and thank them for their wartime efforts. We are proud to have veterans as congregational members and that afternoon dedicated to them. The afternoon was filled with nostalgic memories, brought alive with lyric and music. We say thank you to Valerij and Larissa for the program and Dora for the following meal.

On May 19th we were pleased with a record attendance of Jewish, Christian and Muslim women for Part II of this year's Interreligious Women's Group. The year's theme is "Our Holy Texts and Their Meaning in Our Lives Today." What a wonderful learning experience for everyone to learn about Torah, hear a reading and have a guided discussion by our Rabbi Shillor. This was an exceptional experience for our non-Jewish friends. We believe encounter is the best path to mutual understanding and respect.

The garden of the Reformed Lutheran church was flooded with sunshine and happy faces as we celebrated Lag B'Omer with our neighbors. Celebrating in the church garden has been our tradition for nearly 20 years. Everyone brought a dish to share, our "Barbeque Kings" got the fire going with kosher hot dogs, and even Pastor Sander joined in and had her first taste of kosher wine, declaring it "very sweet." The holiday's history and meaning, explained by Rachel was informative and entertaining, we spoke the blessing together and broke into song as the hours flew by.
