Our congregation is nearing the end of its 19th year. We established our congregation in 1997 with a group of 18 Jewish men and women and a small group of children. The establishment and rebirth of Reform Judaism in Hamelin was not just historic but also miraculous. In 1997, 60 years after the

Shoah, Jewish life returned to the city of Hamelin.

We established our congregation as a Reform community and joined the EUPJ and WUPJ. It was important to us to become members of the largest worldwide organization of non-Orthodox Jewish congregations and follow in the spiritual footsteps of the Jewish congregation of Hamelin that had preceded us. The Reform movement began in Seesen in 1810, here in our state of Lower Saxony.

During the past two decades our congregation has grown and developed. We have learned, celebrated and lived our Judaism together. Children were born and taught, and Bar and Bat Mitzvah celebrations were held under the pleased eyes of a growing congregation. Some members even decided to renew their marriage vows according to Jewish tradition. Rabbi Irit Shillor guided us through it all. We all have matured over the years, especially in our spirituality.

It is then with great pleasure that the Dohme family wishes to share their happiness with members of the congregation in early September as their daughter Rebekka and Amitai Yareev Schleier marry under the Chuppah. Rebekka and Amitai's families welcome you to share their joy and rejoice with them on this very special occasion. The young couple is the first to stand under the Chuppah in our new synagogue.
