Jewish October

Rosh Hashanah, the "head" of the New Year, leads us into the ten days of inner reflection. We are asked to take



personal spiritual inventory. These ten days between New Year and the Day of Atonement, Yom Kippur offer each Jew the opportunity to seek forgiveness between himself and others and then between himself and God. This is achieved through Teshuva—Repentance, Tefila—Prayer, and Tzedaka—Charity.

On Friday, October 7, we will join together in our sanctuary for communal prayer with rabbinical student Adrian Schell. Together we will allow the stirring melody of the Kol Nidre prayer to enter our hearts and minds and carry us through the following days' intensive Yom Kippur prayers. The holiest day of the year will conclude with moving Yiskor services, Ne'ila prayers and a gentle breaking of the fast at sundown. On Sukkoth our rabbi Irit Shillor will be with us. Everyone interested should come at 4:00 p.m. and help build and decorate the Sukkah. Rabbi Shillor will lead services in and around the Sukkah for our members. All Hameln friends and neighbors are invited to attend.

We're thrilled that Rabbi Shillor can return for the joyous holiday of Simchat Torah. Rabbi Shillor will lead services and read the last and first portions. Please join us as we rejoice with the Torah scrolls.

New Sanctuary Additions

Many members have noticed something new on the Bimah. The Torah table has a bronze plaque attached to it. The plaque is a gift from Mr. Otto Bode from Bad Münder. It seems Mr. Bode liked to dig in the dirt around his home when he was a little boy in the 1950s. His greatest "treasure" was the plaque, although he never knew what it was. He did know there was Hebrew written on it. Upon hearing of our new synagogue, he made an appointment with our rabbi. He said he had a gift for the new synagogue and hoped we would like it. As he slowly unwrapped his package, our rabbi's eyes sparkled in recognition. What he had discovered was a "Shiviti," a meditational plaque based on the biblical verse: I have set (shiviti) the Lord always before me (Psalm 16:8). We thank Mr. Bode for this gift, which could have possibly originated from a pre-war synagogue. It has found a fitting home once again.
