Dear members, friends and supporters,

The center of our religious and spiritual life is certainly the Torah. We come together to celebrate the holiday of Simchat Torah each year. In our congregation we look forward to this holiday all year long.

Our tradition is beautiful and meaningful, stirring many to tears of joy. Our two Torahs are passed lovingly from hand to hand, from person to person, from child to adult, from man to woman until everyone has had an opportunity to hold the Torah close to their heart. There is singing and dancing, and the feeling of community is experienced by all. Next, one of the Torahs is completely unrolled and every man, woman, teenager and child helps hold the parchment with utter respect and care. Rabbinical student Adrian Schell, who led the service, stands in the middle of a sea of Torah and glowing faces and reads the last sentences of the fifth book and begins anew with the first reading of the first book.





This symbolizes that Torah has no end, and our learning from Torah goes on and on and on. Happily, Adrian identified and read several sections of Torah and answered any and every question the members posed. After the service, everyone enjoyed sharing their feelings about holding the Torah as the Torah held them while enjoying a festive Kiddush.

Prior to the service, our younger members enjoyed a "Netzer Day" with Jehudith Weinberger and Greta Golbereg. The theme was, of course, Simchat Torah!

Our congregation prides itself in its dedication to Torah study. Almost every Saturday we hold morning services followed by Torah study. The exchange of ideas, the sharing of interpretations from a wide variety of biblical scholars is fascinating and always thought provoking. We look forward to this weekly study with young and old and always welcome new faces. Please join us each Shabbat morning and notice how it will set the tone to your Shabbat.

Our congregation also enjoyed cultural events last month. Polina Pelts offers this description of an outing in October:

Twenty members enjoyed an outing to the city of Bielefeld on October 21st. Our theme was "Jewish Life in Bielefeld." We heard a fascinating lecture about Jewish life in Bielefeld before and after WWII. We then toured the beautiful new Bielefeld synagogue, renovated from a former Lutheran church. The community's social worker, Elena, showed us



the building and answered all our questions. Afterwards, congregational president Irith Michelsohn welcomed us and we enjoyed lunch together in their social hall. Last but not least, Irith took us on a bus tour through the city center. It was a long but perfectly organized and enjoyable day for all.

Jewish November

On November 9th, we will commemorate the "Pogromnacht," 72 years after the destruction of Germany's synagogues, with a memorial service in front of our new building. Wreaths will be laid and we will publically recall the names of the murdered and persecuted Jews of Hamelin, concluding with the communal recitation of Kaddish. Among other readers, our Bat Mitzvah, Patrizia, will read the poem "I am a Star" and our group Schalom will sing several pieces. The lights of our new synagogue will shed a soft light of hope as we remember in sorrow the darkest years of German history.
